Spring 2023 Super Saturdays Registration Information

There is a \$10 Super Saturdays Registration Fee. All other expenses are being sponsored by Hopkins County Schools for this school year. Additional donations to assist in providing future scholarships for children who may not participate otherwise will be accepted. Please review registration requirements and options below.

Who May Register?

Super Saturdays are open to both gifted and exceptional students. All applicants must meet at least one of the following criteria:

- identification for the school's Primary Talent Pool or Gifted and Talented services
- score at the 90th%ile or higher on a Standardized Achievement Test Total Battery;

Students may qualify with a recommendation from a teacher, counselor, or principal stating that the student demonstrates high potential, is motivated to learn, can focus energy working toward task completion AND is able to work cooperatively in a group setting with challenging and accelerated content.

How Do I Register?

All Super Saturdays registrations must be completed online this year.





We have tried to include required forms within the registration so no others will be required at drop-off, however, please make sure all fields are completed to comply with MCC and Hopkins County Schools policies and procedures or additional documentation may be required at drop-off.

Once a class is full, the option to be placed on the Wait List for that class will be added. If a spot opens in a class that was full, you will be contacted in the order of your registration.

PLEASE REGISTER BY: March 3, 2023. *Late registrations are accepted if space is available. Class cap is 18.

Where is Super Saturdays Drop-off and Pick-up?

NEW LOCATION- Super Saturdays will be held at the **Hopkins County Schools Career & Technology Center** this year, located at 1775 Patriot Drive, in Madisonville (between JMMS and Jesse Stuart Elementary).

You will drop your student off at the main entrance of the Hopkins County Schools Career & Technology Center.

Please walk your student in on the first day to check them in and receive your pickup number. Then we have an organized pick-up line where vehicles line up and display your child's number or notify us with alternate pickup information and proper identification.
