

EARLY GRADUATION OPTION



What is the Early Graduation Option?

The Early Graduation Option is intended to target students who have shown high achievement and express their intention to move on an accelerated timeline through high school and graduate college-ready in three academic years or less.

What are the requirements of the Early Graduation Option?

Students choosing to participate must:

- Meet proficiency benchmarks on Kentucky required end-of-course assessments. Currently those classes are English II, Algebra II, Biology, and US History.
- Meet the Council of Post
 Secondary Education (CPE)
 defined college readiness
 benchmarks on college readiness
 exams. Current benchmarks for
 the ACT are English 18,
 Reading 20, Mathematics 19.

What are the Incentives for Students to Choose the Early Graduation Option?

- Students shall earn an Early
 Graduation Certificate and be
 eligible for a one-time scholarship
 award to be paid directly to a
 SACS accredited Kentucky college
 or university. The award shall be
 equal to one-half of the state
 portion of the average statewide
 per pupil guarantee for one year.
- Students who are eligible for the Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES) program and graduate from a Kentucky high school in three years may be eligible for a KEES award equivalent to four years of high school, based on the average of GPA awards.
- Students may enroll in a Kentucky college at least a year early if they meet the requirements of that institution.

When does the Early Graduation Option go into Effect?

The Early Graduation Option went into effect during the 2014-2015 school year.

Who Decides if a Student is Eligible for the Early Graduation Option?

An Early Graduation Committee made up of the student, parents/guardians, and school personnel will make the decision regarding participation. This committee must be in agreement for the student to enter the program.

How Does a Student Apply for the Program?

Any student interested in the Early Graduation Option should complete a Letter of Intent by September 15 of their intended year of early graduation. This may be done as early as the freshman year but no later than the junior year. Students considering the program are advised to contact a guidance counselor to discuss the Early Graduation Option.
